### PHASE II . . . RADIO BROADCASTING RULES

**PURPOSE:** The speaker will practice analyzing and delivering news articles in a radio broadcast format that emphasizes presentation of issues and vocal delivery with limited preparation time.

- The speaker will choose from a selection of news articles that might include: sports, entertainment, politics, weather, economy, domestic, and international news issues.
- The speaker will use their 30 minutes prep time to prepare a 5 minute radio broadcast.
- Articles will be provided to tournament officials by ICCFS.
- The speaker will bring their own notepaper, scissors, glue sticks, highlighters, or any other resources to assist them in preparing the radio broadcast.
- The speaker may not bring additional articles or notes into the Prep Room or the Presentation Room.
- The speaker may not consult anyone or access outside data sources after entering the Prep Room.
- Out of respect for the other speakers, there will be no conversation during prep time.
- The speaker may use as many notes as they wish, provided they are written in the Prep Room. Articles may be cut, pasted, and highlighted.
- Timekeepers will give time signals. The speaker is encouraged to use their own timepiece.

**PREP TIME:** 30 minutes

**TIME ALLOTTED:** 5 minutes

**ETHICS:** All speakers are expected to demonstrate academic integrity and adhere to the highest ethical standards for commanding the platform. See *ICC Standards and Practices* for additional information.
